PRODUCT PROFILE

Pakistan is climatically capable of growing fruits easily and in abundance. The climatic diversity is such that it allows cultivation of nearly all types of fruit- temperate, tropical and subtropical. Apple, apricot, cherry, peach, pear, plum, grape, strawberry and currant are temperate fruit; banana, mango, guava, papaya and tamarind are tropical fruit that cannot stand even light frost and date, fig, orange and pomegranates are subtropical fruits.

Fruits contribute sizeable share with Agriculture Sector of Pakistan with a total production area of more than 0.74 Million hectares (2018-19) in Pakistan. About 30 different varieties of fruits are being produced, and of these Mango, Citrus, Apple, Guava, Melons, and dates are the major produce.

Fruits are exported under the HS code Chapter number 08.

PRODUCTION AREAS IN PAKISTAN

CITRUS

The main citrus producing districts are Sargodha, Sahiwal, Lahore, Sialkot, Jhang, Mianwali, Multan, Gujranwala, Mardan, Peshawar, Swat, Swabi, Noshera, Hazzara, Sukkur, Khairpur, Nawabshah, Mekran, Sibi and Kech.

MANGO

The main mango-growing districts in Pakistan are Multan, Bahawalpur, Khanewal, Sahiwal, Muzaffar Garh, Sadiqabad, Rahim Yar Khan, Vehari, Dera Ismail Khan, Mirpur Khas, Tando Allah Yar, Khairpur, Sanghar, Naushero Feroz, and Matiari.

GUAVA

Major districts of guava production in Pakistan are Larkana, Hyderabad, Lahore, Sharaqpur Sharif, Kasur, Gujranwala, Sangla Hills, Kohat, In addition, Haripur and Bannu.

DATES

Major areas of dates production are Sukkur, Khairpur, Turbat, Panjgur, Muzaffarh Garh, Jhang, Multan, Bahawalpur, Dera Ghazi Khan, and Dera Ismail Khan.
