PRODUCT PROFILE

There are numerous types of sugar but most recognized is table sugar, the white crystals used as flavoring agent and known as sucrose and extracted from sugar beets or sugarcane. Sugar is the second largest Agro-industry in Pakistan. App. 72 sugar mills are operating in various parts of the country and constitutes 4.2 per cent of manufacturing. The value of exports \$ 342 million in 2019 which is 1.47% of total exports from Pakistan . The country is ranked 5th in the world cane acreage and 9th in sugar cane production.

Other types of sugar include Fructose (fruits and honey), Galactose (milk and dairy products), Glucose (honey, fruits and vegetables), Lactose (milk, made from glucose and galactose), Maltose (barley), Sucrose (glucose and fructose and found in plants) and Xylose (wood or straw).

PRODUCTION AREAS IN PAKISTAN

Sugarcane is categorized as a major Kharif crop in Pakistan where cultivation starts from February till April and harvesting season is between October and December. Most of the area under cultivation is in Punjab (65%) followed by Sindh (25%) and KPK (10%).

Sugarcane production for Pakistan was 67.2 million tonnes in 2018 showing an increase from 22 million tonnes in 1969 to 67.2 million tonnes in 2018 growing at an average annual rate of 3.31% .

VARIETIES OF SUGAR

Different types of sugar are manufactured in Pakistan which include pharmaceutical, beverage and commercial grades sugar as well as soft brown sugar, castor and icing sugar, sugar cubes, sachets and retail packs.



TESTING /CERTIFICATIONS

There are certain standards through Pakistan Standards and Quality Control Authority (PSQCA) that have to be complied with by the manufacturers of food and food grade materials. Refined sugar and white sugar PS 1822-2007(R) ICS: 67.180.10

This standard covers the technical provisions of production of Refined and White sugar. The prescribed requirements as per the standard are as per following table:

PACKAGING & STORAGE

Packing if not specified by purchaser should be done in clean sound bags in accordance with PS 1692 for cotton bags and PS 3128 for polypropylene bags for 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100 kg. The mouth of each bag need to be machine stitched. 1kg, 2kg and 5kg shall be packed in polyethylene bags as per PS 4395.
